Shannon Striebich serves as the President of Trinity Health, Oakland Hospital and as Senior Vice President of Operations for Trinity Health – Michigan Region.

Under her leadership, Trinity Health Oakland has developed a reputation for clinical excellence while becoming a regional destination for physicians and patients.Striebich led significant campus redevelopment including the completion of an eightstory, \$145 million South Patient Tower with 204 private patient rooms and nationally award winning technologies. Trinity Health Oakland has received numerous awards for performance in safety and quality including recognition for their stroke and neuroscience programs. women's health. orthopedics. and cardiovascular services. In addition, the organization has consistently earned top scores in colleague and physician engagement.

Striebich began her administrative career at The Detroit Medical Center in 1997 as an Administrative Fellow before taking roles as manager of Operations and director of Physician Services at DMC Physician Group and, later, as administrative director at Children's Hospital of Michigan. Striebich joined Trinity Health in 2002 as director of Facility Planning and Operations at the Oakland campus. Since then, she has held roles of increasing responsibility, including associate vice president of Performance Leadership and Vice President of Operations.

In August 2014, Striebich was named Regional Chief Operating Officer, East Market, for Saint Joseph Mercy Health System, in which she became responsible for operations at both 443-bed St. Joseph Mercy Oakland and 304-bed St. Mary Mercy Livonia, including nursing, ancillary services and facility/support services.

In July of 2016, Striebich was named the President of Trinity Health Oakland (formerly St. Joseph Mercy Oakland). In May of 2021, her position was expanded to include the role of Senior Vice President of Operations for the statewide Michigan region of Trinity Health. In this dual hat role, she continues to lead Trinity Health Oakland, and also has accountability for operations across the State of Michigan including a total of 9 hospitals, imaging and laboratory services, and performance excellence.

She earned a master's degree in Health Administration from The Ohio State University and a bachelor's degree in Health Services Administration from the State University of New York College at Fredonia.

Striebich serves as the Chair-Elect of the Board of the Michigan Health and Hospital Association (MHA). She is the Board Chair for the MHA Keystone Center, is also a board member of CARE House, IHA Physician Group, and is a member of the Advisory Board in the school of business for Lawrence Technical University.She has served as adjunct faculty at the University of Detroit Mercy and is active in her home community of Rochester.
